BUILDING FUTURE LEADERS

"I've grown as a person...I've just become more professional."

17-year-old Victoria aka "Biki" says she's grateful to The Arc Montgomery County. At just 15, she started as an educational student volunteer for the organization through a partnership with her then school Don Bosco Cristo Rey High School. While The Arc doesn't lead its own internship program, it often partners with those that do.

Biki began her journey at headquarters in Rockville, but very quickly her creativity stood out, and it was clear she would be an asset to the children at KFICCC and the teens at After All.

"I love art... I like coloring with them... I like hearing what they have to say."

"Victoria (Biki) is a very creative artist," says Niambi Heyward, Childcare Center Director, "Victoria enthusiastically interacts with children...She has created lifelong friendships with the teaching and administration staff."

Biki started at KFICCC in the infant room and branched out working with school-age children. She also spends time at After All, and says she enjoys all three! Biki says The Arc really gets high school students like herself involved in the day to day. You don't just stand around and watch.

"I feel like it's getting me ready by the skills that I've learned."

Getting her ready for the future! Biki is now a senior in high school, and she splits her day between going to school, and working at The Arc. "I'm very grateful for The Arc letting me have this experience at such a young age."

Biki says she plans on going to college to study nursing and become a pediatric oncology nurse. "I want to help kids while they're at their lowest points in life."

"It's not an experience that you will get any other place...it's pretty unique." -Tony, Educational Student Volunteer

Biki says when she started at The Arc, she wanted to become a homicide detective, but working with children changed that. "Knowing that I've made an impact on their lives and just, like, them coming to me... and just giving me a hug... I like seeing kids happy."

Like Biki, 16-year-old Clayton aka "Tony" was an educational student volunteer with The Arc, as it partnered with the MCPS Summer RISE program, which is for rising MCPS juniors and seniors who wish to participate in a career-based learning opportunity during the summer. Tony gained valuable experience at KFICCC and After All.

"You really need to step up and be more of an authority figure, which I think is something that I struggled with before...but I think I learned a lot of great strategies."

Tony says his time with The Arc helped him decide he wants to become a pediatric nurse practitioner. Reflecting on his experience, he says, "It's something that I had never done before, and also I really enjoyed learning about the people because I think that sometimes what people tend to do is not look past the disability."

"Hosting student volunteers is a win for everyone!," says The Arc Montgomery County CEO Daria Cervantes, "Getting young people involved with the mission of The Arc helps develop our next generation of leaders who are passionate about building inclusive communities."

FROM OUR CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER



I'm proud to share the strides we've made toward our strategic goals—both the visible progress on our website and the significant day-to-day efforts happening behind the scenes. Human Resources & Staff Development has expanded, adding a Recruiter, Onboarding Manager, and Generalist, all focused on addressing our workforce needs. Thanks to their dedication, our vacancy numbers have reached their lowest levels in years, averaging just 30 between June and August. We're not just filling positions; we're bringing on the right people who fit our mission. A special thank you to the entire HR team for their hard work—it's truly paying off!

Since our last update, I'm pleased to report that all regular employees received a 2.5% pay increase. The starting pay for Direct Support Professionals (DSP) in Community Living Services is now between \$22.08 and \$23.19 per hour, while DSPs in Employment & Meaningful Day Services start at \$20.00 to \$21.01 per hour. Job Coaches are now earning between \$21.54 and \$22.63 per hour. Current employees in these roles have also received corresponding increases.

There's even more groundwork being laid right now, and I look forward to sharing our continued progress in the spring newsletter!

PERSONAL SUPPORT SERVICES



It starts from within! The Personal Supports team is growing and laying the groundwork for positive change. DSPs expressed a desire to connect with colleagues and share information about activities throughout the county to make time spent with the people they support more meaningful. This led to the launch of monthly meetings focused on these connections. As a result, people supported are engaging with their community in new ways. For example, one person, a big fan of dogs, enjoyed an unforgettable visit to Bark Social—a hybrid bar, restaurant, and dog park—after their DSP learned about it in a meeting.

Recognizing the need for increased service hours, we've adjusted our plans and hired a new Team Coordinator to improve response times and provide more proactive, person-centered support. These changes align with the division's goal of better connecting with families and enhancing the quality of care.

EMPLOYMENT & MEANINGFUL DAY SERVICES



It's been a busy and rewarding season for Employment & Meaningful Day Services (E&MDS)! From career advancements to fun outings, there's plenty to celebrate. We launched of our first career fair, focused on helping the people we support transition successfully from Meaningful Day services to Employment opportunities. Several people made this exciting shift, marking a significant milestone in their personal and professional growth. Additionally, 3 people supported through a contract with a local company have now been directly hired by the company. Three people we support are now employed by a long-time partner organization. Crews have enjoyed activities, including baseball games, visits to the Capitol and firehouses, catching movies, and having fun at Dave & Buster's, there's always something on the calendar. We even had a great time at the Montgomery County Agricultural Fair! Stay tuned as activities expand over the next few months!

CHILDREN & YOUTH SERVICES







Three members of the KFICCC team are part of an exciting new pilot program. Whitney Howell, Zhara Samarat and Meaza Gebregiorgis are participating in an assistantship program at Howard Community College. As members of the program, assistants take college courses toward their associate's degree. They also receive credit for their degree based on childcare work that they do at the center. This allows them to complete their associate's degree in 18 months, or less.

Their tuition, books and materials are covered by the assistantship. Eventually, The Arc may have to pay a small amount toward their tuition, but to date their entire tuition has been covered. Participants were chosen based on interest and seniority.

COMMUNITY LIVING SERVICES

Community Living Services, along with Human Resources, have been busy welcoming in many new Direct Support Professionals and filling other positions within the division as well! The goal is to have as few vacancies as possible and decreasing the use of staffing agencies to provide support.

Speaking of the homes, some of them got a refresh in the way of new washing machines, dryers, refrigerators, and furniture!

In other news, there has been a lot to celebrate in the way of milestones. Sybil Paul, Direct Support Professional, hit her 30-year mark with The Arc. She works at one of our homes in Silver Spring where three women live and are supported. In fact, one of those women - Mary (Renee) - celebrated her 60th birthday and they all had a party, decorated with a purple theme since that was Renee's wish.

Renee and Schelta had been living together for years, and four years ago, Kimberly moved in. Community Living Services Director Kari Borgealt says the women "look out for one another."

That is obvious when you visit. Renee uses a walker, and Kimberly lets her go first when walking around their house. The DSPs make sure Renee does daily walks all around the home for exercise. Renee also enjoys looking through magazines and clothing catalogues.

Schelta likes to do crossword puzzles and read. In fact, when she comes across a word she doesn't know, she writes it down and looks it up in the dictionary. Recently, she learned the meaning of "abrupt" and "murmured." Sybil says Schelta "really uses her time very creatively."

Kimberly has a part-time job. She also makes friendship bracelets she hopes to sell for \$5 a piece. She saves her money so she can travel and has plans to go to Disney World! Kimberly also cooks, and recently made a breakfast fit for a king for her and her housemates.

As for the future, the women of this home want to continue to celebrate. Kimberly was already talking about the menu for Thanksgiving and says she's looking forward to sitting down with everyone and enjoying some good ol' mac-n-cheese.









RESPITE COORDINATION

The Department of Health and Human Services has permanently suspended income guidelines for primary caregivers of children with disabilities. This change allows Respite Coordination to support more families, expanding the options beyond in-home care to include camps and therapeutic programs. These programs not only provide essential respite for parents and caregivers, but also give children opportunities to build friendships, develop social skills, and engage in enriching recreational settings. Access to diverse programs can have a lasting impact on the lives of children with disabilities, while giving families a well-deserved break. DIGITAL LITERACY CAMP

This past July, The Arc Montgomery County's After All teen summer program hosted a weeklong Digital Literacy Camp. The goal of the week was teaching teens with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) essential digital skills necessary to navigate today's technology-driven world effectively and safely.

Dr. Maryjo Krile, a professor from Eastern Kentucky University who specializes in strategies for teaching digital literacy skills to young adults with IDD, brought her expertise and engaging teaching style to the week. The program covered a wide range of digital literacy topics, including the responsible use of technology, online safety, and the development of teens' technical skills like sending emails. Doreen Engel, The Arc's Director of Children and Youth Programs, shared, "We have benefited so much from watching a master teacher at work. Setting high expectations and watching the teens meet and exceed them is always such a joy."

The camp offered more than just an educational experience; it was a fun and interactive environment for the teens to engage with technology and each other. The enthusiastic feedback from participants highlighted the camp's success in making learning enjoyable and impactful.

This project was funded in part through a SpArc Tank Innovations grant from The Arc Maryland. The Arc Montgomery County is proud to be able to offer digital literacy training through the generosity of these grant funds.

NEW GRANT FUNDING HELPS TEENS, ADULTS, AND SENIORS

We are proud to announce that we are recipients of three Montgomery County Community Grants! The grant funding will support the development of new programs at The Arc that benefit Montgomery County residents. Awarded project funds will go towards these new initiatives:

- 1. Exploration of an after-school program for teens with intellectual or developmental disabilities (IDD) for residents in the county, building on the success of After All, our teen program in Kensington.
- 2. Development of a training program for adults with IDD to become Direct Support Professionals.
- 3. Creating practices and policies that enhance end of life care for seniors with IDD.

These initiatives reflect The Arc's commitment to enhancing the lives of people with IDD across their lifespan. 
